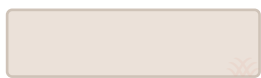


CORNICE Styles

THINGS TO KNOW



STRAIGHT

This typical cornice is finished with a perfectly straight bottom.



STEP STRAIGHT

The cornice's bottom is finished with an inverted stair-step pattern. Typically, heights and widths are proportionally dimensioned.



CURVED STEP STRAIGHT

Attractive combination of straight bottom and stepped end with slight radial curves that terminate at the corners.



ARCHED

The arched cornice has a curved bottom from corner to corner. The apex of the curve must be specified but is typically 4-8" in height.



STEP ARCHED

Identical to the Step Straight, except for the elongated arch between step ends.



CURVED STEP ARCH

Identical to the Curved Step Straight, except for an elongated arch between steps.



INSET ARCHED

This cornice is a combination of the straight and arched cornices, in which the curved arch begins inset from the corner a specified distance.



SCALLOPED

Named after the similar looking scalloped shell, this cornice utilizes multiple radial curves instead of straight lines or arches.



DIAMOND

Welts running from the corners of the cornice cross at the middle to separate contrasting fabric areas. A covered button may be used to complete the look at the center.
